Post-Cardiac Arrest Care Optimize ventilation/oxygenation (Start at 10 – 12 breaths per minute, but do not hyperventilate) Goal: PETCO₂ 35 – 40 mm Hg Use minimum amount of FiO₂ to keep SaO₂ ≥ 94% Consider waveform capnography Keep blood pressure ≥ 90 mm Hg (or MAP ≥ 65 mm Hg) IV fluid bolus: 1 – 2 Liter(s) NS or RL
