Gimbutas' work in both The Language of the Goddess and The Civilization of the Goddess has been criticized by archeologists because of her insistence on her interpretation of the figurines as objective evidence of the existence of a goddess religion and on her "lack of precision, and uncorroborated speculations, particularly in view of her earlier esteemed scholarly work" (Long 1996, p. 16).
