For instance, I used to set up carousel activities during guided reading sessions, hoping these would engage the remaining children and keep them working independently. However, far too often these activities became time fillers, offering little challenge, enjoyment or scope for progress.

Guided reading is a group method of teaching reading skills that can be used in place of, though usually in addition to, occasional 1:1 reading and discrete phonics instruction. Generally speaking, guided reading involves teaching groups of children according to their ability levels.
