On Softail models, the oil reservoir is located under the seat. Look directly below the seat- and slightly behind it - underneath the frame to find the oil drain plug. Use a ratchet and 5/8-inch socket to remove the drain plug. Once loose, finish removing the plug by hand to avoid dropping it into the oil pan. Remove the oil reservoir cap to increase oil flow.

Fill the engine oil tank. The engine oil capacity is 3 quarts (2,800 ml; 100 imp fl oz). Most likely there is still oil left over in the sump, so fill it with 2 quarts (1,900 ml; 67 imp fl oz) and check the dip stick. Add oil until the oil level is between the low and high indicators on the dip stick. Replace the fill cap.

However, most Harley-Davidson® motorcycles use DOT 4 as DOT 5 compressibility and viscosity are not suitable for ABS. Remember to use always the recommended grade for your motorbike or higher. Change your fluid every two years. Or: Whenever the brake pedal/lever seems "spongy". After disassembling the brake line, master cylinder or caliper.
